Meeting Topics, Discussion, and Actions

Preparting students for the growth of AI and data analytics jobs:

- No longer confined to CS/data science transfer programs
- LMI data indicates that careers in cybersecurity, cloud computing, business & marketing intelligence, manufacturing, and agtech are requiring at least a fundamental understanding and application of AI.
- From a Fall 2021 COE report:
 - o 10,204 online job postings the last 12 months
 - Highest postings for Senior Software Engineer,, Software Engineer, Data Scientist, and Data Engineer
 - o Top skills were artificial intelligence, machine learning,, python,, and software engineering
 - o 96% require bachelor degree
 - o Entry-level \$89,550 Median \$110,000
- These roles are narrowly defined, suggesting the CS transfer pathways to AI/ML development vs. roles that implement or support AI ("Blue collar AI").
- 6 Bay Area CCs offer programs that may train for these roles

Actions/Next Steps:

- BACCC will coordinate with Intel to plan and schedule a TTT early 2022
 - Participating colleges should come with an implementation objective
 - At least 3 faculty/college needed
- Plan and schedule an cross-sector AI webinar to raise awareness and introduce opportunities to integrate curriculum in their programs (early 2022)
- Start a ICT/DM CoP focused discussion on existing resources (initiate before EOY)
- Recruit "Tiger Team" for 2022 cyber camps and competitions
 - InfoSec professionals needed as coaches and judges
